TOTC on 2Chr 36: "This seventy-year period is probably best understood qualitatively rather than quantitatively, as a symbol of a human lifespan (cf. Ps. 90:10). An entire generation had to be removed ... More mathematical approaches measure the time from the first exile (605 BC) to Cyrus' edict (539 BC) or from the destruction of the first temple (587 BC) to the reopening of the second (516 BC), but this seems less satisfying." TOTC on Dan 9 adds: "The period of Jerusalem's abandonment, when no worship was offered there, was much less than 70 years (587-538)."
